Bash some Trash this Saturday!

The Quinte Trash Bash returns Saturday, May 8 with COVID-19 precautions in place. After discussions with Hastings Prince Edward Public Health, the committee believes this regional clean-up can resume safely under current restrictions as it takes place entirely outdoors either alone or with members of a single household.

Held each spring for over two decades, the Quinte Trash Bash brings people together to clean up roadsides, parks and sidewalks in Belleville, Prince Edward County, Quinte West and Tyendinaga Township. In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, residents are asked to strictly follow public health guidelines by bashing trash alone or with members of their immediate household.

Although an essential part of past bashes, the committee has decided to postpone the school and business challenges to limit larger gatherings.

Altering this event for 2021 allows it to take place safely, keeping the spirit of healthy communities alive during these difficult times.

Trash Bash is a great way to stay active, but please follow these precautions: wear gloves, use a garbage picker if you have one, practice physical distancing of at least two metres apart from others and wash your hands with soap and water as soon as you get home.
